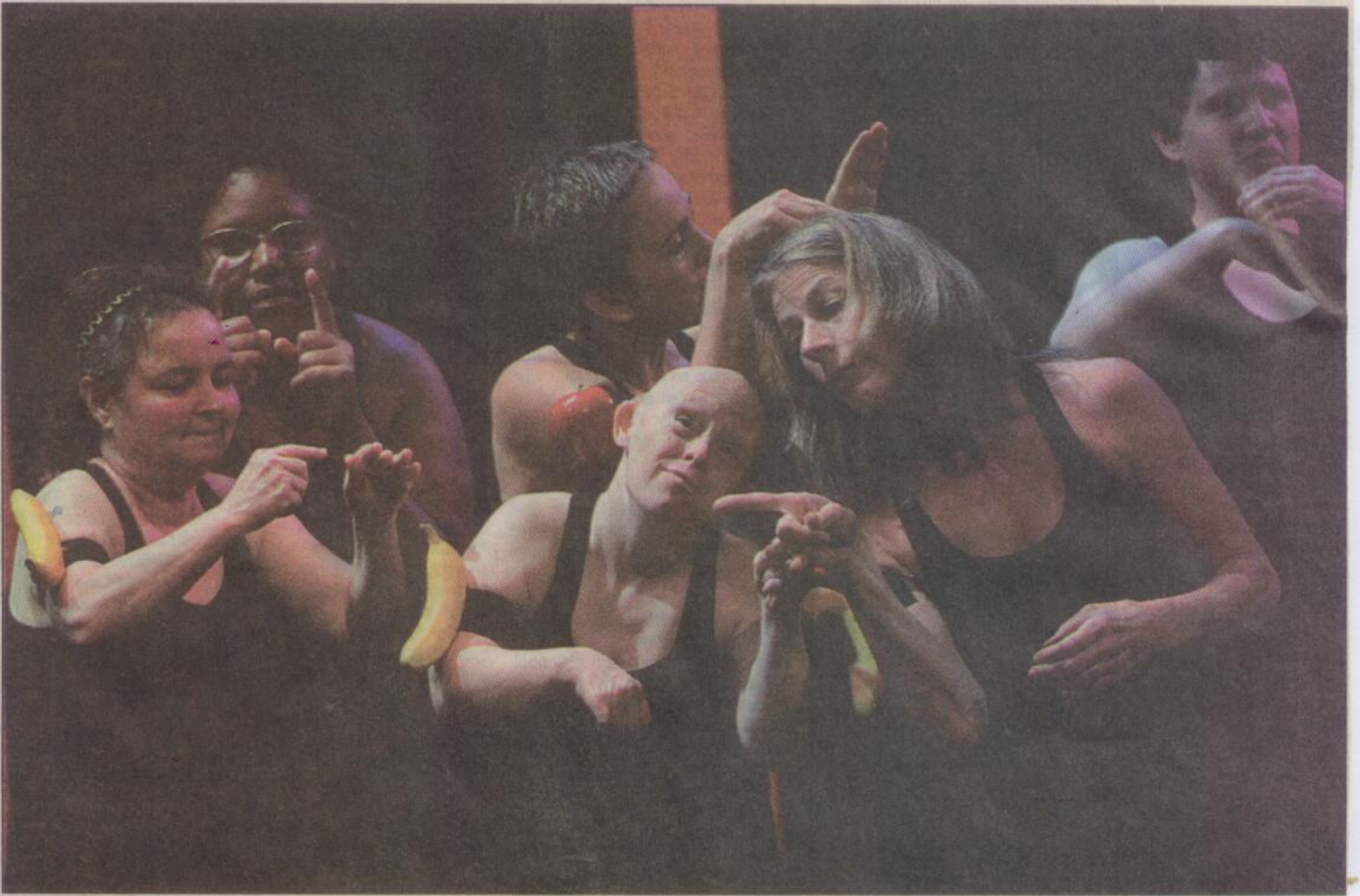


## An artistic anniversary

## Dancers, singers and actors shine at varied performance

LENOX — Tap dancing, theater performances and singing before a packed crowd at the Tina Packer Playhouse were among the highlights of the celebration on Sunday of the 20-year anniversary of the Community Access to the Arts.

Louisa Millonzi, diagnosed with Down syndrome, was one of many who took the stage in CATA's annual performance and gala. She spoke

glowingly about her love of dancing, which she might have been denied if not for the organization, which provides workshops that promote the visual and performing arts.

"In my honest opinion I just love CATA altogether, and I love performing, and I just love being on stage," said Millonzi, 27.
